## Run with Patience

The writer of Hebrews concludes his encouragement to Christians with a command to "run with patience the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith" (Heb 12:1b-2a). Is a patient person just someone who is not easily bored, who can outlast everyone else or win a staring contest? Actually, biblical patience is enduring, continuing to glorify God by following Jesus Christ, regardless of how long or how hard. The model of endurance is Jesus himself, who endured and obeyed through the pain and humiliation of the cross (Heb 12:2), not only for a few hours one Friday, but through a lifetime of sinful opposition from wicked men (Heb 12:3). The lesson for us is clear: we must look to Jesus for strength and follow his example of doing God's will no matter how long it takes or how hard it is.
