We are still looking forward to our first time to meet in the new building, even though we don't know when that will be or what it will look like. Please pray for our church and its leaders as we navigate uncharted waters.

It's easy to feel overwhelmed, but looking out over the ocean teeming with creatures innumerable, we remember that God made and maintains all living things both small and great. How manifold are his works!
