Paul corrects the Corinthian church in 1 Corinthians 4 because they were "puffed up," thinking they were capable of determining the value or worth of God's servants. They had forgotten that Paul and Apollos and others were God's servants, not theirs, and they answered to God, not them (notice the recurring theme of receiving their reward from God in the three analogies in chapter 3). With three rhetorical questions, Paul shows the folly and presumption of judging that way because everything we have, we have received from God (cf. 3:5, 10).



"For who maketh thee to differ from another? and what hast thou that thou didst not receive? now if thou didst receive it, why dost thou glory, as if thou hadst not received it?" (1 Cor 4:7).
